Today's Saint Patrick's Day celebrations have been greatly influenced by those that developed among the Irish diaspora, especially in North America. Until the late 20th century, Saint Patrick's Day was often a bigger celebration among the diaspora than it was in Ireland.

Celebrations generally involve public parades and festivals, Irish traditional music sessions (céilithe), and the wearing of green attire or shamrocks. There are also formal gatherings such as banquets and dances, although these were more common in the past. Saint Patrick's Day parades began in North America in the 18th century but did not spread to Ireland until the 20th century. The participants generally include marching bands, the

military, fire brigades, cultural organizations, charitable organizations, voluntary associations, youth groups, fraternities, and so on. However, over time, many of the parades have become more akin to a carnival. More effort is made to use the Irish language, especially in Ireland, where 1 March to St Patrick's Day on 17 March is Seachtain na Gaeilge ("Irish language week").



The spring season is upon us, and as we approach Lent, it's time to turn our focus to Easter Sunday. It's a wonderful time of year, with warmer weather, Easter flowers, and special traditions with your family. While it's easy to get caught up in the Easter egg hunts and baskets full of goodies, we could all use a reminder of why we're celebrating in the first place. Garbage / Recycling Pickup

Waste Connection Services (WCS) picks up garbage on Mondays and Thursdays and Recycling on Fridays.

Call customer service for all recycle bins. They will bring them out on the truck.

Yard Waste

Waste Connections picks up yard waste every Wednesday. All yard waste must be either in a bin, bags or bundled. If it is left in a pile by the curb and not bundled, it will not be picked up.

Bulk Trash Pickup Thursday

Call at least one day in advance for pick-up requests. Contact a WMS representative at 407-261-5000 and ask the representative for a confirmation number. Please let the representative know that you live in Vista del Lago in the residential section. All white goods (household appliances such as refrigerators, washer/dryers, hot water tanks, dishwashers etc.) have a \$10 per item fee.

All furniture items will be picked up free of charge (up to 3 yards). There is a charge for more than 3 yards. This needs to be scheduled with Waste Connections prior to pick-up, otherwise the items will be left.

Any construction debris such as drywall, fencing, boards etc. will NOT be picked up.

If a pick-up date is missed due to a holiday, trash will be picked up the following pick-up day. (Example - No trash pick-up on Thanksgiving. All trash will be picked up the following Monday).

Please note* Bulk Trash Items MAY NOT be brought to the curb until Wednesday evening!

Leprechaun Paper Plate Craft

If you're looking for a fun and easy St. Patrick's Day craft, then you must try this leprechaun paper plate craft! Paper plate crafts can be an easy craft for kids to do on their own. And they can customize their leprechaun to look however they'd like!



Instructions

- Step 1: Paint the paper plate. Let the paper plate dry.
- **Step 2:** Cut out a hat from the green glitter paper that will fit the size of the top of the paper plate.
- Step 3: Glue a strip of black cardstock to the hat.
- Step 4: Add a gold buckle on top.
- **Step 5:** Cut out a square, then bend it slightly to make a mark with scissors in the middle so you can cut out the center of the square.
- Step 6: Glue the hat to the paper plate.
- **Step 7:** Now start to glue the orange pom poms around the outside edge of the paper plate.
- **Step 8:** Keep gluing pom poms around the outside of the paper plate until you have 2 rows of them glued on. Instead of pom poms you can also use orange torn paper or orange puffy paint.
- Step 9: Glue 2 googly eyes on.
- **Step 10:** Glue on an orange pom-pom for the nose.
- **Step 11:** Using the back of a paintbrush, add two small pink dots for the cheeks.
- Step 12: Add a smirk with a black marker or sharpie.

Recipe of the Month



St. Patty's Irish Soda Bread

Ingredients:

- 4 cups all-purpose flour, plus extra for currants
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 4 tablespoons (1/2 stick) cold unsalted butter, cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1 3/4 cups cold buttermilk, shaken
- 1 extra-large egg, lightly beaten
- 1 teaspoon grated orange zest
- 1 cup dried currants



Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Line a sheet pan with parchment paper.
- 2. Combine the flour, sugar, baking soda, and salt in the bowl of an electric mixer fitted with the paddle attachment. Add the butter and mix on low speed until the butter is mixed into the flour.
- 3. With a fork, lightly beat the buttermilk, egg, and orange zest together in a measuring cup. With the mixer on low speed, slowly add the buttermilk mixture to the flour mixture. Combine the currants with 1 tablespoon of flour and mix into the dough. It will be very wet.
- 4. Dump the dough onto a well-floured board and knead it a few times into a round loaf. Place the loaf on the prepared sheet pan and lightly cut an X into the top of the bread with a serrated knife. Bake for 45 to 55 minutes, or until a cake tester comes out clean. When you tap the loaf, it will have a hollow sound.
- 5. Cool on a baking rack. Serve warm or at room temperature. And ENJOY!

Gardening by the Month



Spring Forward Flowers & Herbs

Plant	Description	Picture
Hydrangea	For a flowering plant that takes up space and makes a statement, go for hydrangea. This big, lush bush with showy, colorful globe-shaped clusters of blooms will brighten your garden all spring and summer long. While it's ideal to plant them in fall, early spring is an option, too. Find a spot with morning sun and afternoon shade, which will keep the blossoms from being scorched, and give the plant's roots plenty of room to grow—the hole should be around 2 feet wider than the root ball. Keep new plants well-watered, and mulch around the base to hold soil moisture.	
Flowering Stock	The beauty of these bold, colorful flowers is surpassed only by their heady fragrance, reminiscent of cloves. In cold climates, stock (also called gillyflower) must be planted from seed each year, but in warmer climates, it can be biennial or perennial. Plant them in springtime to enjoy fragrant bouquets in early summer. Keep the soil moist and remember to pinch off faded flowers to encourage new growth.	
Chives	Chives belong to the allium family, which makes them relatives of onions, leeks, scallions, and garlic. They have been used in Europe and Asia for hundreds of years but can be found around the world. Chives produce edible leaves and flowers; the green stem is long, pencil-like, and thin, with a center that's hollow like a straw. They grow in dense hearty clumps, and typically are one of the first herbs to pop up in the garden in spring. Chives do not require a lot of preparation since they are often used raw, fresh, and as a garnish. A little goes a long way.	
Morel Mushrooms	Morels are edible wild mushrooms that are related to the truffle and prized by chefs and foodies alike. The earthy, nutty, and smokey flavor and unique honeycomb texture and shape make these wild mushrooms the star of any dish, especially since they need very little embellishment when cooked. Unfortunately, morels have a short season, often just a few weeks in some areas—and some years there isn't even a harvest. This is an even more reason to preserve these favored fungi by drying them, so you can enjoy it at any time. Luckily, it's easy to dry morels at home and can be stored in air-tight containers at room temperature for up to 6 months. (For longer storage keep them in the freezer.) Once dried, you simply re-hydrate them to use in recipes like sautéed morels or morel risotto.

Monthly Inspiration



St. Patrick's Day



St. Patrick was born in Roman Britain in the fifth century. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and sold as a slave to a Celtic priest in Northern Ireland. After six years of slavery, he escaped back to Britain. Later, he returned to Ireland and is credited with bringing Christianity to its people. St. Patrick's Day is celebrated annually on March 17, the anniversary of his death in the fifth century. The Irish have observed this day as a religious holiday for over 1,000 years. On St. Patrick's Day, which falls during the Christian season of Lent, Irish families would traditionally attend church in the morning and celebrate in the afternoon. Lenten prohibitions against the consumption of meat were waived and people would dance, drink and feast on the traditional meal of Irish bacon and cabbage.

The Shamrock was considered a sacred plant. The three-leaf clover has been associated with Ireland for centuries. It was called the "Seamroy" by the Celts and was considered a sacred plant that symbolized the arrival of spring. According to legend, St. Patrick used the plant as a visual guide when explaining the Holy Trinity. By the 17th century, the shamrock had become a symbol of emerging Irish nationalism.

The First St. Patrick's Day Parade held in America has been since the 1600s and predates the founding of the United States. Records show that a St. Patrick's Day parade was held on March 17, 1601, in a Spanish colony in what is now St. Augustine, Florida. The parade and a St. Patrick's Day celebration a year earlier were organized by the Spanish Colony's Irish vicar Ricardo Artur. More than a century later, homesick Irish soldiers serving in the English military marched in Boston in 1737 and in New York City on March 17th. Enthusiasm for the St. Patrick's Day parades in New York City, Boston and other early American cities only grew from there.

Now, when it comes to food and traditions for St. Patrick's Day, corned beef and cabbage was an American innovation. The meal that became a staple across the country. While ham and cabbage were eaten in Ireland, corned beef offered a cheaper substitute for impoverished immigrants. Irish Americans living in the slums of lower Manhattan in the late 19th century and early 20th purchased leftover corned beef from ships returning from the tea trade in China. The Irish would boil the beef three times—the last time with cabbage—to remove some of the brine.







PARKING

As a reminder, vehicles are not allowed to be parked on the grass at any time.
