The First Juneteenth

On June 19, 1865, nearly two years after President Abraham Lincoln emancipated enslaved Africans in America, Union troops arrived in Galveston Bay, Texas with news of freedom. More than 250,000 African Americans embraced freedom by executive decree in what became known as Juneteenth or Freedom Day. With the principles of self-determination, citizenship, and democracy magnifying their hopes and dreams, those Texans held fast to the promise of true liberty for all.

Juneteenth Today

In 2021, Juneteenth was established as a federal holiday, opening it to symbolic and global interpretation and providing a better understanding of the evolution of our nation and its people. Juneteenth celebrations then, like now, recognize the ongoing fight for human rights and equality and are commemorated through family cookouts, faith services, musical performances and storytelling. Garbage / Recycling Pickup

Waste Connection Services (WCS) picks up garbage on Mondays and Thursdays and Recycling on Fridays.

Call customer service for all recycle bins. They will bring them out on the truck.

Yard Waste

Waste Connections picks up yard waste every Wednesday. All yard waste must be either in a bin, bags or bundled. If it is left in a pile by the curb and not bundled, it will not be picked up.

Bulk Trash Pickup Thursday

Call at least one day in advance for pick-up requests. Contact a WMS representative at 407-261-5000 and ask the representative for a confirmation number. Please let the representative know that you live in Vista del Lago in the residential section. All white goods (household appliances such as refrigerators, washer/dryers, hot water tanks, dishwashers etc.) have a \$10 per item fee.

All furniture items will be picked up free of charge (up to 3 yards). There is a charge for more than 3 yards. This needs to be scheduled with Waste Connections prior to pick-up, otherwise the items will be left.

Any construction debris such as drywall, fencing, boards etc. will NOT be picked up.

If a pick-up date is missed due to a holiday, trash will be picked up the following pick-up day. (Example - No trash pick-up on Thanksgiving. All trash will be picked up the following Monday).

Please note* Bulk Trash Items MAY NOT be brought to the curb until Wednesday evening!

Memorial Day Luminaries

Supplies

- Glass jars
- Red, white, and blue acrylic paint
- · White piece of paper
- Black Sharpie
- Contact paper
- Paintbrush
- Clear gloss sealer spray
- Twine



Instructions

Step 1: Draw a star on a piece of paper. Place the drawing underneath a piece of Contact paper. Trace the star onto the Contact paper, one for each jar.

Step 2: Cut the star out and peel off the backing. Place the star onto the jar and press to make sure that there are no air bubbles and that all corners are pressed down.

Step 3: Paint jar with one coat of acrylic paint and let dry completely.

Step 4: Make sure the paint is dry before peeling the contact paper off. Pipe glitter glue around the star and let dry for several hours. Spray with gloss sealer and let dry. Give the jar two more coats of sealer spray, allowing it to dry for 20 minutes between coats. Tie twine around the rim of each jar.

Recipe of the Month



Gina Mae's Baked Beans

For this summer-perfect side, Gina dresses up store-bought barbecue sauce with extra brown sugar; apple cider vinegar cuts through the smoky sweetness. For a thicker version of these saucy beans, bake them 10-15 minutes longer before topping with bacon. Beans can be made up to 3 days in advance, covered, and stored in the refrigerator. Let come to room temperature before reheating. See website: https://www.foodandwine.com/recipes/gina-maes-baked-beans.

Ingredients:

- 3 bacon slices
- 1 pound 85% lean ground beef
- ¾ cup finely chopped Vidalia onion or any sweet yellow onion
- 3 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt
- ½ teaspoon cracked black pepper
- 1 cup barbecue sauce (such as Sweet Baby Ray's Original Barbecue Sauce)
- ¼ cup light brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar
- 1 tablespoon smoked paprika
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 2 (22-ounce) cans baked beans (such as Bush's Bourbon and Brown Sugar Grillin' Beans)

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Place bacon slices in a single layer in a 12-inch skillet. Cook over medium-low, flipping occasionally, until browned and crisp, 10 to 12 minutes. Transfer bacon to a plate lined with paper towels, reserve drippings in skillet.
- 2. Increase heat under skillet to medium and add ground beef. Cook, stirring occasionally, until beef is crumbly and just browned, about 6 minutes. Remove from heat. Push beef to one side of skillet; tilt skillet to let drippings drain to empty side. Using paper towels, carefully soak up drippings, discard.
- 3. Return skillet to heat over medium, and add onion, garlic, salt, and pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally, until onion is softened, about 5 minutes. Add barbecue sauce, brown sugar, vinegar, paprika, and cinnamon; stir until well combined. Stir in baked beans, and bring mixture to a simmer over medium, stirring often. Pour mixture into a 2 1/2-guart baking dish.
- 4. Bake beans, uncovered, in preheated oven until bubbling in center, about 50 minutes. Crumble bacon evenly over top and bake for 10 minutes. Let cool for 10 minutes before serving.

Gardening by the Month



Summer Garden Ideas

Plant	Description	Picture
Gladiolus	The Gaudy flower category would have to be the Gladiolus. Though the flowers themselves are beautiful, their stiff form is almost impossible to integrate into a regular garden bed. So, plant them in the cutting garden, in rows near the zinnias flower if possible. This also makes it easier to provide a little support should they begin to list. Plant at least two or three different batches of gladiolus corms, a couple weeks apart. This way you'll have flowers coming into bloom over a six-week period, right up to the winter season.	
Dahlias	Dahlias are easy plants to grow and yield beautiful blooms from mid-summer through fall. In many respects, "dahlia culture" is similar to "tomato culture." Most Dahlias need to be staked and you may want to plant a sturdy stake before you plant the Dahlia. If you put the stake into the ground after the plant is growing, take care to avoid damaging the tuber or the root system. Tomato cages can also be a simple approach to staking. Put the tuber in a hole several inches deep with the "eye" (like a potato sprout) on the tuber facing up. The eye is the point on the shoulder, or crown, of the tuber from which the plant grows.	
Pineapples	Pineapples don't grow on trees, even though fruit typically grows on trees. Pineapples are juicy, tropical fruits that grow on shrubby plants close to the ground. Each pineapple plant only grows one pineapple at a time. After producing its fruit, the leafy shrub dies. To grow a new pineapple plant, you only need to cut off the top of the pineapple fruit and plant it in soil. Very soon, a new pineapple plant will start to grow.	
Peas	Peas (Pisum sativum) are the edible seeds of a type of vegetable plant that produces a pod. They're legumes that are native to the Middle East and are now grown worldwide. They're cold-hardy annuals, and the size of the plants can range anywhere between 1' tall bushes to 9' long vines. There are 3 main types of Pisum sativum (peas): shelling, snow, and snap peas. Within each of these types there are also two different growth habits – bush and vining.

Memorial Day



Memorial Day is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military. Memorial Day 2024 will occur on Monday, May 27th.

Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the Civil War and became an official federal holiday in 1971. Many Americans observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings, and participating in parades. Unofficially, it marks the beginning of the summer season.

The Civil War, which ended in the spring of 1865, claimed more lives than any conflict in U.S. history and required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries.

By the late 1860s, Americans in various towns and cities had begun holding springtime tributes to these countless fallen soldiers, decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers.

It is unclear where exactly this tradition originated; numerous different communities may have independently initiated the memorial gatherings. And some records show that one of the earliest Memorial Day commemorations was organized by a group of formerly enslaved people in Charleston, South Carolina less than a month after the Confederacy surrendered in 1865. Nevertheless, in 1966 the federal government declared Waterloo, New York, the official birthplace of Memorial Day.

Waterloo—which first celebrated the day on May 5, 1866—was chosen because it hosted an annual, community-wide event, during which businesses closed and residents decorated the graves of soldiers with flowers and flags.

Did you know? Each year on Memorial Day a national moment of remembrance takes place at 3:00pm local time.

Attention Homeowners

Please recall that our prospectus requires that all guests staying on property for any length of time must be registered. However, any Short-Term Guests or New Residents of your homesite, who are staying over 30 days and over the age of 18, must **APPLY and BE APPROVED** to stay on property. We have added new registration procedures for adding any new Primary-Resident, Primary-Occupant, or Short-Term Guests to your homesite:

From the Vista Del Lago website:

- The **homeowner** can register the correct type of Resident or Short-Term Guest using the correct form which can be found on our new **Registration** page under the Registration and Applications tab.
 - Please note that the Registration page is password protected. Please call the Vista Del Lago Clubhouse for the current password.
 - The Registration page will provide info on each type of Short-Term Guest or Resident type to help the homeowner choose the appropriate Registration form.
 - The homeowner can register more than one Short-Term Guest or Resident to their homesite on the same registration form. Please keep in mind that Occupancy limits still applies (2 occupants per bedroom).
 - A confirmation page with next steps will appear once the registration form is submitted.
- Homeowner with Guests or Residents that is staying longer than 30 days will direct each of their new Guests or Residents to the Vista Del Lago website to start the application process by using the Online Application Information page under the Registration and Applications tab on the home page.
 - Please note that the Online Application Information page is password protected. Please call the Clubhouse for the current password.
 - The **Guest or Resident** will fill out the online form with their basic information.
 - We ask the homeowner to advise their new Guest or Resident of the proper **Application Type**, Primary Resident, Primary Occupant, or Short-Term Guest, based on the type of registration form that the homeowner had submitted.
 - A confirmation page with next steps will appear once the Online Application Information form is submitted.
- Within 72 business hours of receiving **BOTH** the **Registration** form and the **Online Application Information** form at the Clubhouse, an agent will review each of the forms and send out an Application Link email to the new Guest or Resident to complete the application process.
 - Please note that the email with the application link will be coming from InfoRequest@VerifyProtect.com
 and the application must be completed within 7 days of the email. The link will expire after 7 days.
 - In the application portal, the new Guest or Resident will be able to upload all supporting IDs and/or documents based on their application type and pay the \$50.00 non-refundable application fee.
- Once the application(s) are approved, the new Guest or Resident will receive an email from Vista Del Lago congratulating them and asking them to contact the Clubhouse for their final steps. The Clubhouse will also reach out to the homeowner to advise them of their final steps.



GOLF CARTS

PARKING

As a reminder, vehicles are not allowed to be parked on the grass at any time. Vehicles can be parked on the curb during the day, but no overnight parking is allowed along the curb anywhere on the property. Additional parking is available for a limited period of time near the tennis courts with a permit from the Clubhouse.

WARNING TO HOME SELLERS

If you are attempting to sell your home by yourself, or it is being represented by another broker besides Vista Sales, be proactive in having your prospects secure residency before finalizing the sale.

WILDLIFE

In Florida it is illegal to feed raccoons, sand hill cranes, bears, foxes and alligators. Violators can be charged with a second degree

misdemeanor punishable by up to a \$500 fine and 60 days in jail. If you are having an issue with wildlife on your lot, you can call Animal Control Services or an animal trapper.

DRIVE SAFELY

Remember to always drive safely and keep within the posted speed limits of 20 mph. Avoid speeding at all times and be mindful of surroundings. Children could be playing nearby or residents may be taking a walk. The life you may be saving may be your own!
